- Luke 8:38 But the man from whom the demons had gone out was begging <1189> Him that he might accompany Him; but He sent him away, saying,
- Luke 9:38 And a man from the crowd shouted, saying, "Teacher, I beg <1189> You to look at my son, for he is my only *boy*,
- Luke 9:40 "I begged <1189> Your disciples to cast it out, and they could not."
- Luke 10:2 And He was saying to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore beseech <1189> the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest.
- Luke 21:36 "But keep on the alert at all times, praying <1189> that you may have strength to escape all these things that are about to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."
- Luke 22:32 but I have prayed <1189> for you, that your faith may not fail; and you, when once you have turned again, strengthen your brothers."
- Acts 4:31 And when they had prayed <1189>, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and *began* to speak the word of God with boldness.
- Acts 8:22 "Therefore repent of this wickedness of yours, and pray <1189> the Lord that, if possible, the intention of your heart may be forgiven you.
- Acts 8:24 But Simon answered and said, "Pray <1189> to the Lord for me yourselves, so that nothing of what you have said may come upon me."
- Acts 8:34 The eunuch answered Philip and said, "Please <1189> *tell me*, of whom does the prophet say this? Of himself or of someone else?"
- Acts 10:2 a devout man and one who feared God with all his household, and gave many alms to the *Jewish* people and prayed <1189> to God continually.
- Acts 19:36 "So, since these are undeniable facts, you ought <1189> to keep calm and to do nothing rash.
- Acts 21:39 But Paul said, "I am a Jew of Tarsus in Cilicia, a citizen of no insignificant city; and I beg <1189> you, allow me to speak to the people."
- Acts 26:3 especially because you are an expert in all customs and questions among *the* Jews; therefore I beg <1189> you to listen to me patiently.
- Romans 1:10 always in my prayers making <1189> request <1189>, if perhaps now at last by the will of God I may succeed in coming to you.
- 2 Corinthians 5:20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg <1189> you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

Prayer Appendix A

2 Corinthians 8:4 begging <1189> us with much urging for the favor of participation in the support of the saints,

2 Corinthians 10:2 I ask <1189> that when I am present I *need* not be bold with the confidence with which I propose to be courageous against some, who regard us as if we walked according to the flesh.

Galatians 4:12 I beg <1189> of you, brethren, become as I *am*, for I also *have become* as you *are*. You have done me no wrong;

1 Thessalonians 3:10 as we night and day keep praying <1189> most earnestly that we may see your face, and may complete what is lacking in your faith?

1 Timothy 5:13 At the same time they also learn *to be* idle, as they go around from house to house; and not merely idle, but also gossips and busybodies, talking about things <1189> not proper <1189> *to mention*.

1 Peter 1:6 In this you greatly rejoice, even though now for a little while, if necessary <1189>, you have been distressed by various trials,
